1. Each exhibitor in this show will pay a fee of \$60 per head entered. From this fee, \$30 must be mailed to the National Western Stock Show as a breeding cattle standard entry fee and \$30 must be mailed (along with a copy of the entry form) to the Colorado Simmental Association, 24614 Road G, Sugar City, CO 81076 as a show, ultrasound and DNA fee. Separate mailings are required by NWSS and CSA. Fees will be doubled if not postmarked by Nov. 20. All fees must be paid in U.S. funds.
2. All animals must be registered with the American Simmental Association. Animals competing in purebred classes must be 7/8-blood Simmental or higher. Animals competing in the percentage classes must be between 1/2-blood and less than 7/8-blood Simmental. Original registration papers must accompany all animals at time of check-in.
3. Actual birth weights on all bulls must be submitted with the entry.
4. All animals must be tattooed prior to arrival. All animals must have a legible tattoo that matches registration papers which will be checked at the show. Any animal not having a legible tattoo, or firebrand or freeze brand is ineligible and will be barred from showing.
5. Colorado Simmental Association reserves the right to mouth one or all animals.
6. All animals must be dehorned.
7. All entries will be measured at time of check-in. Frame scores using Beef Improvement Federation Guidelines, weight, weight per day of age (WDA) and the most current EPD's on all entries will be collected. Ultrasound will be done for the national show. Scrotal circumference will be measured on all bulls entered in the bull division. Weights, WDA's, EPD's and ultrasound data will be printed for each animal in the program. The frame scores will be reported in the show program either as class ranges (minimum and maximum for each class) or on an individual basis. The performance information will be provided to the judge to use in conjunction with the visual appraisal.
8. All bulls fifteen (15) months of age and older must have a current semen test/breeding soundness exam by a non-owner, licensed veterinarian and show to be a satisfactory potential breeder. The test must have been done within sixty (60) days prior to show date. All females eighteen (18) months of age or older must be: a) certified pregnant by a licensed, non-owner veterinarian, or b) certification that she has been used in embryo transfer.
9. All bulls twelve (12) months of age or older must be shown with a nose lead or ring.
10. Only one (1) showman per animal will be allowed while in the show ring.

11. Females and bulls will be judged youngest to oldest. Percentage then purebred divisions. Animals will enter the ring starting with the youngest first. All must be in the makeup ring before conclusion of the prior class. Any animal not at ring side when its class enters the ring will be scratched.

12. DNA testing will be done on all Division Champions as they exit the ring. Division Champions failing to submit to DNA testing will not advance to the Championship drive.

13. Animals that have not been processed will not be eligible to show. Colorado Simmental Association reserves the right to bar any animal/exhibitor from showing that does not meet the requirements of this show. Check-in and processing, including weighing, checking tattoo, pregnancy testing (for sale females only) and ultrasound, will be Sunday afternoon, Jan. 16<sup>th</sup> on the hill.

GROUP CLASSES

GOS. Get-of-Sire: Four animals, both sexes represented, any age, sired by one bull. Animals may be owned by more than one exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in individual classes to be eligible ...B

POD. Produce-of-Dam: Two animals, either sex, out of the same dam. Animals may be owned by more than one exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in individual classes to be eligible ...B

BH. Breeder's Group: Four animals, both sexes represented. Animals owned by single exhibitor. All animals must have been shown in individual classes to be eligible ...B

Premier Exhibitor: Animals must be owned or co-owned by the exhibitor. Award based on points accumulated in individual class. One point will be awarded for each animal an individual is placed above in his or her individual class (Example: in a class of 8, first place will receive seven points, second place will receive six points, etc) ... D

Premier Breeder: Breeder is defined as individual(s) or organization(s) listed as breeder on the registration paper and identified by ASA breeder ID number, Award based on points accumulated in individual classes on animals bred (but not necessarily owned or exhibited) by one individual or firm. Same point system as Premier Exhibitor....D
